INTRODUCTION

The first Anglican (Church of England) services held in the Launceston area were conducted in 1811 by the Rev R Knopwood. In 1818, Rev John Youl was appointed to the northern settlement. He later became Rector of St John's Church which opened in December 1825. However, with the town's population increasing, a meeting was held in May 1838 to formulate plans for a second parish. Land was granted in August 1839 at Holy Trinity's present site on the corner of George and Cameron Streets. The original church, designed by James Blackburn and built by Joseph Moir to accommodate 500 people, was dedicated on 27 December 1842. The Diocese of Tasmania was established the same year, Van Diemen's Land having previously come under the Diocese of Calcutta.

In 1897, the original church building was declared unsafe, although it continued in use until 30 November 1902. A building committee was formed and Alexander North asked to design a new church. It was built by J & T Gunn and, although incomplete at the time, was consecrated on 4 December 1902. A combination of Byzantine and Gothic Revival in architectural style, the church was not finally completed until 1986. In religious practice Holy Trinity has followed the High Church tradition (Anglo-Catholicism) since the 1920s. It was introduced by the then Rector, Canon E G Muschamp.

Several properties originally owned by Holy Trinity in the Cimitiere Street-Lawrence Street area, known as the Glebe, were finally sold in the early 1980s. The period of church ownership of these properties is well documented in this collection. The Parish of Holy Trinity has benefited financially from income generated by the Glebe properties, as well as a number of bequests such as the William Stepney Trust.

Other parishes associated with Holy Trinity at different times include

St Barnabas, Parish of Newnham, opened in 1851, closed in 1887, and not to be confused with a later church of the same name built in 1905,

St George's, Invermay, originated as a Sunday School in 1886. The first church was consecrated in 1887, although a separate parish was not established until 1923,

Church of the Holy Family, Russell Street, originated as the Inveresk Mission Hall built in 1894. The first church building was dedicated in April 1930 but destroyed by fire in 1971. The present church was consecrated in 1975.

Some early registers of baptisms, marriages and burials for Holy Trinity and the original Parish of Newnham were microfilmed by the Archives Office of Tasmania in July 1995 (AOT: NS 1735/1-10). The items concerned are identified in this guide. Public access to some more recent registers whose contents are less than 50 years old is currently restricted. Minutes of meetings and correspondence less than 25 years old is also restricted.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in November 1996, with one item donated in March 1992.
