INTRODUCTION

The Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania was established by the Federal Government as part of its plan for a national Good Neighbour Movement. The Movement was designed to welcome and help migrants, who arrived in large numbers after the Second World War.

The *Mercury* of 2 November 1949 reported that a meeting of church and welfare organisations had been held in Hobart to form a Good Neighbour Council, with the national co-ordinator of the Movement present. Two days later a meeting to establish a Council in the north of the State was held in Launceston. The constitution of the Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania was adopted at a meeting in Launceston on 28 July 1951.

The Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania was supported by Federal Government funds, with a modest grant from the State Government. It was concerned with contacting, welcoming and helping new arrivals, drawing on existing services to form a network of voluntary assistance to newcomers, while remaining non-political and non-sectarian.

Branches were established in Hobart and Launceston in 1950 and subsequently in a number of towns around the State. The branches maintained collections of household goods to lend to new arrivals and lent money from a Distress Fund to those in need of temporary financial aid. Migrants, particularly women at home, were assisted to learn English. Migrants were encouraged to become Australian citizens and their contribution to the community was publicised through art and craft exhibitions, dance performances, concerts and scholarships.

The Council conducted conferences and seminars which examined problems encountered by migrants, prepared publications for intending migrants, new settlers and volunteers and established information resource collections.

Albert Schluter was elected President of the Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania in 1977, the first non-locally born president in the Council's 27 year history.

The Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania marked its silver jubilee in 1975 with statewide celebrations. That year a Federal Government report unfavourable to the Movement was released, which ultimately led to the Good Neighbour Movement losing its Federal Government funding in June 1980. The Movement was replaced by Migrant Resource Centres. However the Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania continued to function, providing a voluntary service. In 2002 the Launceston Branch focused on the needs of elderly migrants, conducting a day centre at 13 Frederick Street every Friday and holding day trips and outings. The Burnie Branch operated a drop-in centre. Both branches functioned under the umbrella of the Good Neighbour Council of Tasmania, which had a postal address in West Moonah. Tasmania was the only State in which the Good Neighbour Council Movement still existed.

The records were donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in June 2000.
