INTRODUCTION

Launceston Tatlers was founded in 1962 by Pip Horner (previously a member of the Adelaide Tatlers' Club) with the aim of bringing together a group of women who were interested in writing and to further explore that interest.

Meetings are held each month, except January, at members' homes. From its inception Launceston Tatlers elected office bearers, kept minutes and organised venues and activities, maintaining a structured procedure according to a six-month program. Two social functions, in July and December, were held each year.

The oral presentation of papers written to a specific topic by members was the principal activity of a Tatlers meeting, with a book reviewed over the summer discussed at the February meeting. The minutes contain a precis of every paper presented. Papers presented at meetings were placed in the archives, and once a year voted on for permanent retention, a system abandoned in the 1980s when every paper was archived.

Membership has fluctuated during Tatlers' history. The first constitution set a membership limit of 20 and throughout the 1960s there was an extensive waiting list. There were references to the need for a membership drive during the 1970s and at the end of the 1980s; after that time numbers remained constant between 10 and a dozen.

Although Tatlers published some papers in simple hand made booklets in 1966 and 1967, then more ambitiously in 1985, the group's major publication is the substantial and impressively produced *An inspired pursuit: forty years of writing by women of Northern Tasmania*, Canberra, Karuda Press, 2002. The book contains over 80 pieces of writing, prose and poetry, fiction and non-fiction, on diverse subjects, taken from the group's archives. It is a small sample of some 600 papers archived since 1962. The book also includes a comprehensive history of the Tatlers.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in March 2003. Further material covering the period 2003-2007 was donated in August 2012.
