INTRODUCTION

Albert and Sarah Corrick, their seven daughters and one son, of Christchurch, New Zealand, were gifted musicians and entertainers:

Albert (1849-1914) was a music seller and teacher, piano tuner and choirmaster. The violin was his special instrument

Sarah (1853-1935) was a singer and piano teacher

Gertrude (1878-1945) was a pianist, accompanist and cellist

Alice (1880-1955) was a fine singer who was taught the piano and viola

Amy (1882-1968) played the flute and piccolo

Ethel (1884-1971) was a singer and played the violin

Leonard (1886-1967) played the clarinet and saxophone, sang comic songs and was a projectionist and cinematographer

Ruby (1888-1948) played the cornet and French horn

Jessie (1892-1956) was a singer and played the violin

Elsie (1894-1974) was a singer, composer and played the violin, piano and organ

The family initially performed at entertainments in Christchurch before embarking on a successful tour of the north and south islands of New Zealand, commencing at the end of 1900. At that time the touring party consisting of Mr & Mrs Corrick, the five eldest girls and Leonard. To add variety to performances, during the New Zealand tour Albert acquired a set of 150 hand bells which he played with the five girls and Leonard. Amy, Ethel, Ruby and Leonard also performed Scottish and Irish dances.

At the suggestion of a relative who lived in Hobart, Mr & Mrs Corrick, Gertie, Alice, Amy, Ethel, Ruby and Leonard toured Tasmania in 1902. Highly successful tours of the mainland capitals followed by performances in many country and outback towns made the Corrick family a household name for the next 13 years. The press invariably commented most favourably on Alice's singing.

When the family commenced performing, magic lantern slides were used as a backdrop for the singers, but before they left New Zealand Albert bought a projector and some films from a touring company to show as a part of the family's program. Over the years a large collection of films was acquired. Leonard was the projectionist and "Leonard's Beautiful Pictures" received separate billing on the program. In 1906 he began taking his own films of people in the streets to show during the evening performance. An electric light plant was used to illuminate the stage, interior and exterior of country halls at a time when only capital cities had electric light.

Acclaimed by the press, the Corricks were immensely popular. In 1907 they departed Fremantle on what their advertising material described as "a world's tour" which took them to Ceylon, India, Burma, Malaya, Java and Sumatra, finally arriving in England in August 1908. There they performed at a number of London theatres. Jessie, then 15, was included in the tour.

On their return to Australia in mid 1909, the Corricks again toured all the states. Elsie's first performance with the family was at Newcastle in 1912. Albert died at Launceston in March 1914 whilst the family was on a tour of Tasmania. Tours of Victoria and New South Wales preceded a tour of New Zealand in 1915.

Most members of the family settled in Launceston in 1915, where they enriched the musical life of the city. They conducted the Corrick School of Music, the Corrick Orchestra provided music for silent movies at the Majestic Theatre, took engagements for visiting shows at the Academy and Princess theatres and the family performed in concerts to raise funds for charitable causes. Leonard was conductor of St Joseph's Band and the Launceston Concert Orchestra for a short time, he showed pictures and held dances at the St Leonard's picnic ground and was part of an orchestra that played for balls and dances at the Albert Hall and dances at St Albies Hall.

The Corricks made their final appearances in 1932. In March members of the family performed at a concert at the Albert Hall to raise funds for the Tasmanian Sanatorium and on 12 and 13 April they gave two performances at the Hobart City Hall, the first for the Tasmanian Sanatorium, the second for the Blind, Deaf and Dumb Institution.

The Launceston community showed its appreciation of the family's services in raising funds for public, charitable and religious bodies over 17 years by giving a citizens' complimentary concert at the Albert Hall on 19 April 1932. Mrs Corrick, Leonard, Gertrude, Alice, Amy, Ethel, Ruby, Elsie and her son Norman entertained a packed house. The Mayor later presented the family with an illuminated address of appreciation on behalf of the citizens of Launceston.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in May 2000.
