INTRODUCTION

Edith Mary Jessie Ransom, born at Hobart in 1888, the eldest daughter of Thomas Stannus and Sarah (nee Mason) Todd, married Vernon Ransom of “Killymoon”, Mount Nicholas, in 1912 at Bellerive. (1) Before her marriage she studied at the Conservatorium, University of Melbourne. Mr & Mrs Ransom lived in the Fingal Valley for some years after their marriage, where Mr Ransom was a farmer at Ormley. In the 1930s they lived at Dilston, Windermere and “Newnham Hall” on the East Tamar before moving to “Pleasant View”, St Leonards. Several years after her husband’s death in 1944 Mrs Ransom moved to Longford. (2)

Edith Ransom, who was awarded an MBE in 1967, died on 5 November 1968, survived by her daughters Mary and Leonie. (4) Her son Arthur Vernon had died in 1923 at the age of four (5) and her husband Vernon died in 1944. (6)
