INTRODUCTION

The Tasmanian Agricultural and Pastoral Society was founded in June 1873. The Society was reconstituted in 1898 following a suggestion by John Gunning, who drafted the Society's new constitution, that a more comprehensive show should be presented which reflected the wide range of industries practised in Tasmania. The reconstituted Society had a broader focus. One of its main objectives was to present urban as well as rural industries and to reflect both country and city interests. In 1921 the Tasmanian Agricultural and Pastoral Society changed its name to the National Agricultural and Pastoral Society of Tasmania, the first Show Society to become fully national. As a result all classes of competition were open to competitors from the whole of Australia, except for a few which were open only to Tasmanian entrants. The addition of the prefix Royal was approved in 1984 by HRH Queen Elizabeth II and the Society was called the Royal National Agricultural and Pastoral Society.

The Society's first show was held in September 1873 in Invermay, where York Park is now situated. In 1882, after the Launceston City Council requisitioned the removal of all Show buildings, the show was moved to a new location. However this location was found to be inadequate and limited the activities that the Society was able to present. Following the reconstitution of the Society, the show was relocated to the Elphin Show Grounds. The Society first leased these grounds, but purchased them in the 1930s. The size of the Show Ground was increased in the 1940s with assistance from a State government grant. The show was held at the Elphin Ground from 1899 to 1997, except during the Second World War when the Ground was occupied by the Armed Forces for training purposes. As a result the show was not held in 1940, 1941 or 1942. In 1943 a special 'War Time Show' was held successfully, despite the limitations imposed by war time conditions. It included special exhibits relating to the war effort. A 'Victory Show' was held in 1945 to celebrate the end of the war, although conditions were still difficult. In 1998 the Show's venue moved to the Inveresk railyard site. (*Examiner* 9 October 1998)

As well as holding the annual show, the Society maintained a wider interest in primary industry production, including government policy on the subject. It was also involved with a number of clubs, councils and societies, including the Northern Tasmanian Trotting Club and the Kennel Council of Tasmania. Some of these organisations, particularly sporting groups, used the Show Ground for their activities. The Show Council of Tasmania was formed at the suggestion of the Society. This body was created to meet a need to coordinate the dates on which the various agricultural shows around the state were held. It also served as a forum for addressing other issues which affected bodies such as the Show Society. Like the Show Society, the Show Council maintained an interest in primary industry production and related issues.

Four series of correspondence constitute the bulk of the collection. The first series includes files arranged alphabetically and are titled by the subject of their contents. The second series is arranged chronologically and is indexed. The items included in this series were originally held together in letter books, but have been divided into parts during archival processing to help their preservation. The third series of correspondence is arranged alphabetically and is also indexed. The fourth series is arranged alphabetically and chronologically, but is not indexed. The second, third and fourth of these correspondence series mainly include correspondence with competitors and exhibitors. The fifth series of correspondence contains only one item.

Items donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in February 2002 were added to an earlier donation.
