#### INTRODUCTION

The Circular Head Arts Festival (CHAF) was first held in 1976 to promote and encourage arts and crafts in the district. One of the main instigators and organisers was Mrs Meg Close, committee secretary from 1976 to 1980.

Dame Enid Lyons opened the first festival on 7 September 1976 in the Stanley Town Hall. During the ceremony Dame Enid read a proclamation declaring Stanley a historic village. The festival, staged after only a few weeks organisation, was extremely successful, with more than 50 artists and crafts people taking part. A special holiday was granted to the district to mark the occasion, a tradition which continued up to and including the 1993 festival.

In 1977 the festival, occupying four venues, and featuring a songwriting contest, the first for Tasmania, and a \$400 art purchase, was a huge financial success. The following year the competitions included an inventor's competition, another Tasmanian first, which attracted a number of entries from around the State. Competitors for some sections came from interstate.

A variety of entertainments, many catering for children, musical performances, book launches, fashion parade, Nut fun run and even camel rides were features of succeeding festivals. A separate literature festival was held from 1991 to 1993.

A constitution was adopted in 1981, and in 1985 the CHAF became an incorporated body.

In 1984 the festival, the biggest and best-known week long event of its kind in Tasmania, was visited by 7,500 people. Each year it made a substantial contribution to the Tasmanian tourist industry.

The Van Diemen's Land Company Store, first used as a venue for displays in 1984, was leased from the Municipality of Circular Head in 1986. After Lyons Cottage was leased in 1987, it was used for some displays. The 1989 festival attracted 800 entries, the 26 categories and awards making administration a major task.

The festival continued to remain profitable, but by the early 1990s attendances were dropping and sponsorship decreasing. The 1994 festival was postponed until March 1995, to take advantage of the better weather. The 1995 festival format, changed due to the small number of people to organise the event and limited funds, was a success. But due to an insufficient number of members, the CHAF committee went into recess in July 1995.

The Circular Head Council ran a successful new look CHAF held from 24 to 26 May 1996, but it proved to be the last festival.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in February/March 1997.
