INTRODUCTION

The collection consists chiefly of programs for northern Tasmania pacing clubs. They cover the years 1943 to 2000 (plus two earlier ones for the Northern Tasmanian Trotting Club) and provide a good overview of pacing in the north of the state. These years saw the amalgamation of several clubs: the Carrick Trotting Club and Westbury Trotting Club combined in 1976 to form the Carrick Park Trotting Club and the Danbury Park Trotting Club and the Northern Tasmanian Trotting Club merged in 1978 to form the Launceston Pacing Club. The period also saw the word 'trotting' replaced by 'pacing' in the name of some clubs.

The racing club programs are not as comprehensive as those for the pacing clubs, but several for the Newnham Racing Club and the Tasmanian Turf Club date back to the early years of the 20th century.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in June 2005. The collection belonged to Thomas Owen Storay, who was born in Launceston on 27 November 1912. He was a successful harness racing owner, breeder, trainer and driver who began his career as a 14-year-old saddle jockey and followed his father into harness racing. He competed locally and in Melbourne and Sydney and drove some of the best horses in Tasmania, including five winners at the St Mary's New Year's Day meetings, and trained numerous winners. He served on the committee of the now defunct Danbury Park Trotting Club and was also involved in the Northern Tasmanian Light Harness Association. From 1981 he was listed as an honorary member of the Launceston Pacing Club in the club's programs. Tom Storay, one of Tasmania's best and most respected harness racing drivers, died in Launceston on 14 September 2005, aged 92. (References: *Examiner* 2 January 2004, 15 September 2005).
