Encourage your students to explore and experiment with textures, patterns, materials and content. QVMAG's exhibitions provide inspiration of diverse voices relating to the Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up! theme and are on display at the Queen Victoria Art Gallery, Royal Park from 10am to 4pm daily.

ArtStart entries should be delivered to the Queen Victoria Art Gallery, 2 Wellington Street, Launceston before 4pm Friday 10 June 2022.


