INTRODUCTION

The Trevallyn Improvement Association first met on 17 May 1915. Its objective was to improve Trevallyn as a residential suburb through:

improvement of reserve and private property frontages proper provision of cross streets and rights of way extension of the tramline, street lighting and the suburban boundary reservation of areas for sports and other public purposes establishment of a junior state school reassessment of unimproved and unoccupied land

These specific issues dominated the Association's activities into the 1950s. The establishment of Trevallyn Primary School was an early achievement. The Association mooted the Max Fry Memorial Hall and the Bowls Club, and the Tennis Club was formed under its auspices. By the 1970s activities focused more on the development of the Trevallyn Recreation Area and general street matters.

The Association's name had changed to the Trevallyn Park and Improvement Association by 1929.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in May 1995.
