INTRODUCTION

The Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St John of Jerusalem, one of the oldest Orders of Chivalry in the world, had its origins in the First Crusade in the 11th century. The modern order in England dates only from 1858, but was responsible for the founding of the St John Ambulance Association in 1877. The Association's activities subsequently spread to the larger English towns and to the colonies. St John Ambulance Brigade evolved through trained St John workers forming ambulance stations. In Australia, these effectively pioneered our ambulance transport services.

The history of St John Ambulance in Tasmania began in Launceston where a committee was formed on 31 March 1887. Its main aim was to teach and provide first aid. Segregated into male and female divisions until after the Second World War, the majority of its male members were recruited from Launceston Railways employees. St John in Hobart was not established until 1909, and the two sub-centres remained separate entities governed by the parent body in England until they became one Tasmanian centre in 1942. At that time, the Order of St John in Australia became a Commandery. It was elevated to the status of Priory in 1946. The Priory, the controlling body for both the St John Ambulance Association and St John Ambulance Brigade, has its national headquarters in Canberra, ACT, where a library for the Order is also maintained. The Tasmanian state headquarters are located in Hobart.

In Tasmania, St John workers played an active role in wartime civil defence, and have subsequently continued to provide voluntary first aid services at major public functions and sporting events, and train young people in first aid and home nursing. By the late 1970s there were 23 adult and 15 cadet divisions located throughout the state.

St John House (previously known as Waratah House), 12 York Street, Launceston, was purchased by St John Ambulance and renamed in 1959. At the time it was sold by St John in 1996, it was the Northern Headquarters for all St John Association and Brigade activities in Tasmania, including cadet training. Part of the premises was also leased to other bodies.

Most of the papers dating from the 1950s and 1960s were originally kept by Dr Geraldine Archer. She was instrumental in the purchase of St John House and maintained an active interest in the work of St John Ambulance until her death in October 1992.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in November 1997.
