1.ISABELLA JANE MEAD (1912-1969)

Isabella (often known as Isabel) Jane Mead was born at Launceston on 1 February 1911, the only daughter of David Thomson and his wife Bertha Angelina (nee Fullbrook).¹ She was named after her two grandmothers.²

David was the youngest son of Alexander Thomson Jnr and his wife Isabella (nee Brown),³ who were married in Edinburgh on 26 December 1848. Isabella was the daughter of John Brown, warehouseman,⁴ and Alexander the eldest son of Alexander Thomson, solicitor of Edinburgh.⁵ Alexander junior, born on 11 October 1828,⁶ died in Launceston on 20 April 1887.⁷

Alexander Jnr and Isabella came to Launceston “under engagement to the late Mr Henry Dowling”, at that time a printer and publisher,⁸ c.1849. Isabella, “a native of Edinburgh” “served her apprenticeship as a bookbinder with her late husband with the firm of W. and R. Chambers”.⁹

When their first child, Alexander Brown, was born in 1850, the Thomsons were living in Brisbane Street, as they were two years later when Marian was born. Alexander’s occupation was given as bookbinder.¹⁰ In 1853 Alexander, bookbinder, Charles Street, adjoining the *Cornwall Chronicle* office, advertised that he “executes every description of binding, both plain and ornamental, gilt or marble edge, Law, Music Books, Portfolios etc. Account books made to order. A respectable youth as an apprentice wanted”.¹¹

In January 1854 Alexander was advertising his “Cheap Toy Bazaar” in Charles Street, opposite the Star Inn,¹² and in April, under the heading “Bookbinding” and at the same address, he stated that having engaged a first rate assistant he would be able “to turn out all orders intrusted to him with the utmost dispatch”.¹³

According to the Launceston valuation roll for 1859 Alexander was occupying a house and shop in Charles Street between Brisbane and Paterson streets, but the next year he had moved to a house and shop further south in Charles Street, between York and Elizabeth streets. This would have been 144 Charles Street, premises which remained in the family for many years and ultimately formed part of June Warrillow-Williams’ estate.

Isabella died at her residence in Charles Street, where she had lived for fifty-eight years, on 26 February 1911.¹⁴

David Thomson, bookbinder, stationer and poster advertising agent,¹⁵ was born in Launceston c. 1862. He married Bertha Angelina (nee Fullbrook) in 1909.¹⁶ He died on 27 April 1937 at his stationer's shop, 144 Charles Street, at the age of seventy-five. According to his obituary he was very interested in horse racing and had at one time raced horses.¹⁷

Bertha Thomson was born in Longford on 19 October 1881, the daughter of James Fullbrook and his wife Jane Amelia (nee Garcia).¹⁸ Bertha and David's only son, David Alexander, died of tuberculosis on 22 July 1935 at his parent's residence, 144 Charles Street, aged twenty-one years.¹⁹ After her husband's death in 1937, Bertha continued to run the advertising business for some years.²⁰ Bertha died on 1 September 1966 at her residence, 11 Union Street.²¹

The Thomsons lived on Westbury Road, on the south west corner of Peel Street, for some years, and not long before she died, Isabella wrote an account of her childhood memories of the neighbourhood and the people who lived nearby.²² Isabella's aunt, Jean Thomson, had a fancygoods and toyshop in Charles Street, and when this became too much for her, David and his family moved to live at the shop. His bookbinding business was conducted at the rear of the shop.²³ Jean died at the residence of her brother, Mr D Thomson, 144 Charles Street, in 1929.²⁴

After attending Glen Dhu Primary School, Isabella commenced at Methodist Ladies College in 1924.²⁵ A student in the Department of History at the University from 1929 to 1932, she also won the Sir Philip Fysh prize for philosophy, and was admitted to the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1935. Whilst attending the University she was prominently associated with the Australian Student Christian Movement.²⁶ In October 1931 she had obtained a Diploma of Associate of Theology.²⁷

Isabella proceeded to the University of Sydney to do honours work in psychology, living at Deaconess House, Newtown.²⁸

In 1935 she taught at Quambaar Girls' School, Belle Vue Hill, but had to return home at the time of her brother's death.²⁹

From 1936 to 1940 Isabella was a member of the staff of Broadland House Church of England Girls' Grammar School, initially part time while she gained her teacher's registration, then senior mathematics mistress.³⁰

In 1939 Mrs Thomson, Isabella and June Warrillow-Williams, Mrs Thomson's niece who had lived with them in Charles Street, moved to Lime Avenue.³¹

In the early years of the Second World War, feeling the need to do some patriotic work in industry, Isabella resigned from Broadland House, to work at Paton & Baldwins from 1941 to 1946, at first in the mill, then as senior invoice clerk. She also served as librarian there, and in the evenings taught mathematics and English to RAAF recruits.³²

In April 1947 Isabella was appointed to the staff of the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery as Assistant to the Director, N J B Plomley.³³ Mr Plomley assigned her to give particular attention to the museum's historical and fine arts activities.³⁴

Two years later she took extended leave from April until the end of the year to travel overseas with her cousin June Warrillow-Williams. Whilst touring England, Italy, Switzerland, Belgium and New Zealand she took the opportunity to inspect museums and art galleries.³⁵

During her time as Assistant to the Director she was instrumental in having the library's holdings catalogued.³⁶

Mr Plomley resigned as Director in April 1950;³⁷ in July Isabella was appointed Acting Director³⁸ and in January 1951 she was appointed Director.³⁹ Thus she became the first woman to head a major public museum in Australia.⁴⁰

Isabella's achievements were impressive. One of her first tasks was to give the building a thorough spring-cleaning, useless material was discarded and galleries that had been closed for renovations were reopened.⁴¹ She reorganised the Joss House, writing a descriptive booklet that was published by the end of her first year at the helm.⁴²

The Shell Gallery was made suitable for receptions, and what was to prove a much used lecture room for meetings fitted out, with Isabella upholstering the chairs herself, due to lack of funds. The geological gallery was reorganised and anthropological displays brought up to date. Stacks of old newspapers were sorted and items of historical interest noted on a card index system, the first card index system at the museum.⁴³ While Director Isabel was invited to become a member of the Melbourne Lyceum Club.⁴⁴

In September 1953 Isabel resigned to marry Ernest Richmond Mead of Sydney.⁴⁵ Following the 24 October wedding, which took place at St John's Church, Toorak, Victoria,⁴⁶ the Meads settled in Melbourne.⁴⁷ In 1955 they travelled overseas.⁴⁸

Gardening was a great source of pleasure to Isabel, and in 1954, whilst living in Melbourne, she became co-founder of the Australian Geranium Society. She was also an active member of the Royal Australian Horticultural Society and the British Pelargonium Society.⁴⁹

Upon Ernest's retirement from business the Meads removed to Tasmania early in 1957 to live in "Woolmers Cottage", Longford, where Isabella won a number of prizes with the Longford Garden Club.⁵⁰ Ernest died of World War 1 injuries on 25 June 1959 at the Concord Repatriation General Hospital in Sydney.⁵¹

In 1960 the architectural firm of Roy Smith, Willing & Newman designed a charming house for Mrs Thomson and Isabel at 11 Union Street.⁵² June Warrillow-Williams continued to live with her aunt Bertha and cousin Isabella, and in the spacious grounds of "Rochford" they created a lovely garden.

Isabella was an office bearer in a number of organisations. By 1944 she had held executive positions with the Launceston Branch of the Australian Student Christian Federation, Old Collegians' Association, Launceston Graduates Association and Women for Canberra Movement.⁵³

Historical research was an abiding interest: a foundation member of the Tasmanian Historical Research Association, Isabella became chairman in 1963. She was also secretary and later chairman of the Royal Society of Tasmanian (Northern Branch); chairman of the Historical Committee of the National Trust, a member of the council of its northern division and a key figure in the Trust's centenary history of Campbell Town book. She served as secretary and president of the Women's Graduates Association, was secretary of the National Council of Women and a member of the Launceston Literary Society.

Her love of travel led to membership of the Victoria League for Commonwealth Friendship in Tasmania, Royal Overseas League, Tasmanian Branch and Royal Commonwealth Society, Northern Tasmanian Branch.⁵⁴

After her return to Tasmania from Melbourne Isabella wrote an impressive number of carefully researched articles on historical subjects.

Isabella Jane Mead died at her home, 11 Union Street, after a battle with cancer, on 21 August 1969.⁵⁵ Her name is remembered in the biennial Mead-Smith-von Stieglitz Memorial Lecture established by the National Trust in 1973 to honour three former members.⁵⁶

2. JUNE CAROLINE WARRILLOW-WILLIAMS (1917-1997)

June Caroline Warrillow-Williams was born at Launceston on 19 December 1917, the daughter of Daphne Caroline and Arthur James Warrillow-Williams.⁵⁷

Arthur Williams, son of Mr & Mrs A J Williams of Edgbaston, Birmingham, England, died in Brisbane on 3 December 1922, aged thirty-six years. From the wording of the death notice, Daphne seems to have been living in Launceston at the time.⁵⁸ Daphne died in London on 30 April 1929.⁵⁹

June and her brother Nigel came to Launceston soon after their mother's death to live with their mother's sister, Mrs Bertha Thomson. In 1931 Nigel commenced school at Launceston Church Grammar School and June at Methodist Ladies College. June had previously attended the Notre Dame Collegiate School in Leeds, England.⁶⁰ Nigel was enrolled under the name Nigel Arthur Warillow Williams, and later in life June hyphenated her surname to Warrillow-Williams. There are photographs of a Warrillow family tombstone in St John's churchyard, Hanley, England in the collection.⁶¹ She corresponded with her English relatives and visited Mr & Mrs Thomas Warillow Pickering in Leeds on her trips to England.⁶²

June continued to live in Launceston with her aunt Bertha and cousin Isabella, moving with them from 144 Charles Street to 3 Lime Avenue, then to "Rochford", 11 Union Street, her home until she died.

After she left school, where she had undertaken commercial studies, June had an interesting and varied career, punctuated by extensive overseas trips. For six years she worked as invoice clerk and bookkeeper for T Norman Henty & Co., followed by two years with L W Smith Pty Ltd. From 1953 to 1955 she was engaged in bookkeeping for C J Weedon & Co., then she was employed by Senator J A Guy until his electoral defeat in 1956, when she became Senator Robert Wardlaw's secretary. For a time she worked in the Launceston branch of the Industrial Acceptance Corporation before becoming secretary to Federal Labor Member of Parliament, Gil Duthie, from 1962 until his electoral defeat in 1975.⁶³

When Nigel married Valerie Joyce Green in February 1949, June was a bridesmaid.⁶⁴ She was also bridesmaid when Isabella married Ernest Mead in 1953.⁶⁵

A keen traveller, included in June's overseas holidays were a trip to the United Kingdom and Europe with Isabella in 1949; Europe with her aunt Bertha in 1955; United Kingdom with her

aunt and Isabella in 1964; United Kingdom and Europe with Isabella in 1967; United Kingdom and Europe in 1970; a South Pacific cruise in 1972; United Kingdom and USA in 1974; and several Asian countries and Canada in 1980. She also enjoyed a number of trips to the Australian mainland.⁶⁶

June shared Isabella's enthusiasm for the National Trust. An early member of the Trust's financial committee and an early member of the Northern Region's Historical Committee, for her commitment and contribution she was made an honorary life member in 1994.⁶⁷

She was also a member of the Royal Society of Tasmania, Northern Branch; Tasmanian Historical Research Association; Royal Overseas League, Tasmanian Branch; Victoria League for Commonwealth Friendship in Tasmania; Royal Commonwealth Society, Northern Tasmanian Branch; Launceston Literary Society; Tasmanian Fellowship of Writers, Northern Branch and the Riverside Golf Club.

June spent much time tending the large garden at "Rochford", an occupation she enjoyed.⁶⁸

June Warrillow-Williams died on 23 August 1997 while on a visit to Melbourne. She was buried at Carr Villa Cemetery with Isabella.⁶⁹

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in 1997.
