INTRODUCTION

Samuel John Sutton was born on 19 April 1836 in Hobart, the eldest child of Samuel Askew and Sarah Elizabeth (nee Fielder) Sutton. Samuel senior arrived in Hobart in 1834 and at the time of his son's birth his occupation was given as writer. The Suttons were living in Launceston by the time their second child, Edmund, was born on 27 July 1838.

Educated in Launceston, Samuel became a baker and confectioner with premises in Wellington Street. A temperance advocate and lifelong total abstainer, in the early 1880s he built the Launceston Coffee Palace in Brisbane Street, conducting the business until c1901.(1) The subsequent owner changed the coffee palace's name to the Metropole.(2)

First elected to the Launceston Municipal Council in 1885, Samuel was mayor 1890-1892 and 1898. He was a member of the House of Assembly for South Launceston 1891-1897 and for Launceston 1901-1903.

He was president of the Launceston Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Launceston Licensing Bench, Justice of the Peace, chairman of Commissioners of the Tasmanian Exhibition in Launceston in 1891, a commissioner of the Tasmanian Exhibition in Hobart 1894-95, vice-president of the Prisoners' Aid and Rescue Society in Launceston, chairman of the Launceston Benevolent Society and treasurer of the London dock labourers' fund in 1889 and a deacon of the Tamar Street Congregational Church.

An alderman for 21 consecutive years before declining health brought about his retirement, he was the first mayor to wear the robes of office. A man of initiative, during his first term as mayor he was one of the driving forces behind the Tasmanian Exhibition held in Launceston, the building of the Albert Hall and the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery, the provision of deep drainage and the installation of electric street lighting. In 1898 he was mainly responsible for the holding of the Juvenile Industrial Exhibition.

Samuel married Annie York on 4 March 1862 in Launceston. Annie died on 3 March 1876. At Westbury, on 9 August 1876 he married Jane Ann French, who died in childbirth the following year. He married Emma Eliza Farmilo (born at Hobart on 22 September 1856) on 4 March 1880 in Hobart. They had seven children:

Marjorie Gwendolyn, born 24 January 1895, died 28 March 1989

During Samuel's terms as mayor the Suttons were noted for their hospitality, holding

civic receptions, garden parties and a juvenile ball. Emma also took part in public life: she was a founding member of the Queen Victoria Hospital for Women and the YWCA in Northern Tasmania.

In 1901 the family moved from the Launceston Coffee Palace to “Fairlawn”, the imposing house on Elphin Road built for Samuel by J & T Gunn. Samuel did not live long to enjoy the house and its extensive garden, he died at “Fairlawn” on 7 September 1906. Emma and the children continued to live in the house.

When Cecil married Percy Frank Cuthbert Mattingley in 1910, a lavish reception was held at “Fairlawn”. Percy had joined Leslie in the latter’s dental practice at 36 Brisbane Street in 1909.(3) The Mattingleys lived at “The Gunyah”, Newstead, until they moved to “Fairlawn” to live with Emma and Marjorie about 1920.(4)

Cecil and Percy had three sons, Maxwell Albert Percy (born 1913), Brian John (born 1914) and Cecil David (born 1922).

Emma died at “Fairlawn” in 1939. Percy and Cecil also died there, Percy in 1966 and Cecil in 1971, leaving Marjorie the sole occupant of the house. She died on 28 March 1989, at the age of 94.(5)

“Fairlawn”, 138 Elphin Road, was auctioned at the end of June 1989, and its contents went under the auctioneer’s hammer early in July.(6)

The remainder of the information on the family comes from the Sutton Collection; Miranda Morris, *A methodology for the interpretation, identification and promotion of the heritage of women in Tasmania*, Hobart, 1997, and Scott and Barbara Bennett, *A biographical register of the Tasmanian parliament 1851-1960*, Canberra, 1980.

The Sutton Collection was acquired from three sources. The State Government purchased a number of items at the sale of the contents of “Fairlawn”, 138 Elphin Road, Launceston (the Sutton family home from 1901 to 1989) on 8 July 1989, which are on permanent loan to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery; donations were subscribed by the public shortly before the contents sale to enable the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery to purchase material; and a significant amount of material from the estate of Marjorie Sutton was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in December 1989. Additional items were donated in September 1992 (no 3/4) and January 2002 (nos. 16/1-16/21).
