INTRODUCTION

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INTRODUCTION

The Launceston Art Co-operative was formed on 21 October 1992 by nine artists to provide an artist-run exhibition space for practising artists and craftspeople who lived in the Launceston area. It was to be self-funded, without government grants or sponsorship, thus giving members freedom in presenting their art. The Co-operative was the brainchild of artist Bea Maddock and ceramicist Robert Ikin.

A small two storey brick building, formerly a dilapidated warehouse at the rear of 144 Charles Street, in Bender's Lane, with its entrance off the York Street car park, was rented. It was decided to adopt the name 'Snakepit' as it was rumoured that a snake trainer had once leased the building. The Co-operative held monthly meetings, and management was maintained by a system of rotating monthly managers.

Three tiers of membership were established. Full membership was limited to 26 members, allowing each member to hold an exhibition for a fortnight each year, with the member having curatorial and administrative responsibility for all aspects of the exhibition. Reserve members, limited to 25 in any one year, automatically became full members the following year. Associate membership was available to interested people who wanted to be included on the mailing list. Patron membership was introduced in 1995. Patrons made a financial contribution towards the running of the gallery, and in return, as part of their membership, were presented with an original, limited edition print, produced by a member of the Co-operative.

Hiss Review and the Snakepit Calendar were distributed every three months to all members, with copies available for sale.

The first exhibition was held in January 1993. The gallery hosted over 100 fortnightly shows to the end of 1996, involving 111 artists, as well as six Snakepit Group Shows. The list of all exhibitors is included in 6/11, folder (2).

At the end of 1995 it was becoming harder to find bookings for shows, and in October 1996 a decision was made to dissolve the Co-operative. However a new group was formed: the gallery's name changed to the Snakepit Art Space, exhibition terms were made more flexible, involvement with students and the community was to be expanded and membership extended outside the Launceston area. The quarterly publication was renamed *Snakebite*.

When the building was to be sold in 1998, the committee, already concerned with the low level of participation in gallery activities, decided to close the gallery. The last exhibition was held in April 1998.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in July 1998. Additional items were added in 2008.
