#### INTRODUCTION

Greyhound racing at White City, 124-126 Invermay Road, Launceston, was pioneered by J G (Jack) Nelson and M A (Arthur) Morgan, both great coursing enthusiasts.

In 1932 Mr Nelson, who owned and lived at "Malunna", which became the site of the White City complex, laid down a straight track at his own expense. Due to the efforts of Mr Nelson and Mr Morgan, the White City Speed Coursing Track Pty Ltd was formed. Other men associated with its inception were A A E Nelson, O J (Ollie) Illingworth, J C Stuart, J Robinson and H W Heathcote.

The first meeting, a seven-event program, was held on the night of 8 February 1933. In 1934 an amendment to the 1932 Bookmakers Act allowed bookmakers to operate at coursing meetings and in 1935 the Totaliser Act was amended, permitting the use of a totaliser at speed coursing meetings. However the company was not financially successful and at a public meeting on 26 September 1935 the Launceston Greyhound Racing Club was formed. The club leased the track from Mr Nelson and in April 1936 agreed to pay him £200 to construct a circular track, an improvement which proved popular with patrons.

The Launceston Cup, the club's feature event, was first run in 1936. The club made a profit for some years, enabling the White City complex to be developed. During the Second World War money was donated to the war effort. The 1941-42 season saw the club's first deficit, mainly due to the Commonwealth Government War Precautions Act which prohibited night racing. The club held day meets and despite having to compete with racing and trotting meetings, managed to make a small profit the following year. After the traditional night meetings resumed in December 1945, the club made a substantial profit for some years and stakes were increased.

During the 1947-48 season the club purchased White City. In the 1948-49 season a photo finish camera was installed. Improvements in the 1950s included a new kennel complex and the size of the track was increased from 430 to 548 yards. At the club's annual meeting on 15 August 1955 it was reported that the installation of the electric hare was a milestone for the club. In 1960 a new cafeteria was constructed.

Improvements in the 1970s included re-roofing a portion of the betting area, better lighting, the running rail was replaced, the car park concreted and the Bramich lure installed. TAB betting was introduced in the 1973-74 season, but the following six years were financially difficult, although at the same time stakes more than doubled.

In the early 1980s the grandstand was upgraded, a new amenities stand completed, track lighting replaced and electric timing and computerised totalisator betting on course introduced. The club was incorporated on 21 August 1986. Monday 7 August 1989 saw the club linked to Sky Channel.

The last race meeting at White City was held on Monday 13 December 2004 prior to greyhound racing being relocated to the Mowbray Racing Centre. Over 1000 people attended the meeting. The three racing codes, gallops, harness and greyhound, were brought together at the one venue and the White City complex was subsequently sold.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in February 2005.
