INTRODUCTION

Carrilla Daniel Sullivan, a mining engineer, was born in Melbourne in 1841, the son of Richard and Eliza Sullivan. ¹ He was living at Bonang, Gippsland, when he married Henrietta Louisa Yeates at Holy Trinity Church, Launceston, in 1889. ² Henrietta, born in Launceston in 1864, was the daughter of Henry and Henrietta Yeates. ³ The Sullivans had five children, Henry Carrilla (born 1890), Edna Lily (1892), Alice May (1894, later Mrs T Solomon ⁴), Ruby Elizabeth (1896) and Stella Marie (1899).

Mr Sullivan was the manager of mines in Victoria and included in the records are a number of papers relating to the New Bonang Gold Mining Company at Bonang, North-East Gippsland. He was also involved with mining at Lefroy and Mathinna in Tasmania.

The Sullivan family came to Tasmania in 1897. According to Wise's *Tasmania Post Office Directory* for 1898, C Daniel Sullivan was living at Delamere Road, Trevallyn: in 1907 he was still at Delamere Road and Carilla D Sullivan was listed as a grocer at 148 Cimitiere Street. The 1909 directory listed Mrs H L Sullivan as a grocer at 148 Cimitiere Street. Carrilla Sullivan died on 7 August 1912 at his residence, 148 Cimitiere Street, Launceston ⁵ and Henrietta died at Launceston on 23 June 1946. ⁶

Charles Henry Francis Shearn, born at Hobart in 1845,⁷ married Mary Ann Richards at St Leonards in 1871. ⁸ Mary Ann, daughter of William and Elizabeth Richards, was born at Launceston in 1844. ⁹ Their only child, Percy Charles, born in 1873, died at Launceston in 1893. ¹⁰

Charles Shearn was the legal manager for a number of mining companies. Included in the records are a number of papers relating to the Bonanza Proprietary, a gold mine at Beaconsfield, which adjoined the Tasmania Gold Mining Co., and some items concerning the latter company. Mr Shearn was also treasurer of the Society for Tuition of the Blind in the north of the state. ¹¹

Charles Shearn died at his residence "Percyville", 127 Invermay Road, Launceston on 5 July 1917 ¹² and Mary Ann died at "Percyville" on 23 May 1922. ¹³

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in 1957.
