#### INTRODUCTION

Randolph Stuart Sanderson (1860-1933), known as R Stuart Sanderson, was born and educated in London. Acting on advice to take a long sea voyage to improve his health, he arrived in Melbourne in 1880. After coming to Burnie a few days later, he joined the staff of the Van Diemen's Land Company, becoming the Company's secretary. He was the first secretary of the Emu Bay and Mount Bischoff Railway Co. (an offshoot of the VDL Co.) and for a time also acted as stationmaster.

Of a studious nature and gifted with a retentive memory, Mr Sanderson took advantage of his position as Company secretary to become an authority on Tasmanian history and Tasmanian nomenclature. He personally followed the routes of the early Company explorers, checking descriptions recorded in their diaries. He gave lectures on their expeditions and also delivered a number of lectures to the Workers Educational Association on Shakespearian plays and other subjects. A lover of the bush, he was a pioneer of the popular tourist outings to St Valentine's Peak.

He was a member of the first Burnie town board, director and secretary of the Emu Bay Butter Factory and a director of the NW Freezing Co.

After 30 years of service he resigned his position as secretary of the VDL Co. and acquired an interest in the Burnie firm of Tattersall's Pty Ltd, hardware importers, ironmongers and timber merchants. He was director and secretary until the time of his death.

An active member of the Loyal Wellington Lodge, MUIOOF, he occupied every office in the order.

He married Martha Maud, eldest daughter of James Norton-Smith (manager of the VDL Co. from 1869 to 1903) at St George's Church, Burnie, on 13 May 1902.

Mr Sanderson died at Burnie on 31 May 1933, aged 73, respected by all sections of the community. He was survived by his widow and two sons, a daughter having predeceased him some years previously.

A feature of the records are Mr Sanderson's small personal diaries from 1881 to 1932, (except for the missing 1888 and 1912 diaries) which provide a concise record of his activities.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in March 1949.
