INTRODUCTION

Cecil George Richardson (known as George) was born at Launceston on 12 August 1938, the son of a miner and linesman father and ex-music hall singer mother. A fourth generation Tasmanian, he spent his first two years at the abandoned Lefroy goldfield.

From 1940 to 1955 he lived at Launceston where he was educated at West Launceston Primary School and Launceston High School, his life-long friend Wal Sutherland a fellow student at the latter school. After obtaining his art teacher diploma at the Hobart Technical College Art School in 1958, he taught at Deloraine High School and Launceston High School, then lectured in art at the Launceston Teachers' College. He was awarded a certificate of education from the University of Tasmania and in 1967 gained a diploma in fine art in painting and sculpture. From 1967 until 1972 he taught in Sydney. Before resuming his teaching career in northern Tasmania he was gallery officer at the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in 1973.

He was a founder member of the Australian Society for Education through Art, 'Images' group, 63 Salamanca Images Gallery, Appleshed Gallery Co-Op, Old Brisbane Arcade Gallery Co-op, Ritchies Mill Arts Centre and Lilydale Craft Guild. He was also involved with the Launceston Art Co-operative. George's final exhibition with the Images group, 'Images 37', was held in 2004.

He became a potter and proprietor of the Golconda Pottery and also illustrated the three volumes of *Gravely Tasmania*, *Tasmanian Anecdotal Diary* and *Windows: Poems* by Wal Sutherland.

A member of the Vietnam Moratorium and an adherent of Quakerism, he was a dedicated conservationist and a well regarded art teacher. For some years he lived with his family on an abandoned goldfield at Golconda.

George Richardson died on 20 March 2005, survived by his wife Penny, son Dirk and daughters Claire, Kathy and Daisy. ¹

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in July 2006.
