#### INTRODUCTION

Ella Elizabeth Pegus Dudley, the youngest daughter of Frederick Henry Pegus Dudley, was born in Kensington, Greater London, in 1882. <sup>1</sup> Following the death of her parents and on the advice of a Tasmanian nurse in England at the time, she came to Launceston where she trained as a nurse at the Launceston General Hospital. Commencing in 1902, she was a probationer during the 1903 smallpox epidemic. After passing her final exams she returned to England. Later she came back coming to Tasmania when St Margaret's Hospital opened and was in charge of the theatre. St Margaret's Private Hospital was established by Dr John Ramsay in 1912.

Ella Dudley of "Danehurst", Putney, England, and Dr John Ramsay of St Margaret's Private Hospital, Launceston, became engaged in May 1913. They were married on 1 October 1913 in Sydney. <sup>2</sup> Their four sons and two daughters were born between 1914 and 1923. A son, one of twin boys, died in infancy in 1923.

The Ramsays lived at St Margaret's Hospital and the adjacent "Nelumie" for 20 years. "Ruglen" in Pyenna Avenue was their weekend house until they moved there permanently after it was enlarged.

Dr Ramsay (1872-1944) was appointed C.B.E. in 1924 and knighted in 1939 for services to surgery, the first Launcestonian and the first medical man in Tasmania to be so honoured.

Lady Ramsay was active in the community and renowned for her hospitality. She was President of the Launceston General Hospital Central Auxiliary and a life member. She had been the first President of the St John Ambulance Auxiliary, formed in 1933, which changed its name to the Central Auxiliary in 1945. She was a Northern Division of Junior Red Cross committee member, an office bearer of the Ministering Children's League, a foundation member and Vice-President of the Northern Branch of Royal Derwent Hospital Auxiliary and a member of state executive of the Red Cross Society.

Lady Ramsay had a passion for travel. *Here and There*, the account she wrote of her travels, commencing in 1910, was published in Launceston c1960. She had travelled overseas 13 times, six times by air. All proceeds from the sale of the book were to benefit various charities.

Sir John Ramsay died at "Ruglen" on 6 February 1944. Lady Ramsay died in a private hospital at Launceston on 23 September 1978, aged 96. She was survived by her daughter Nell and son James.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in May 2004. One item had previously been donated in February 2004.
