

Prologue

The close of the 19th century saw many social changes which were reflected in the houses being erected. While in upper class households the 'servant problem' became an ever increasing worry, other occupations holding more attractions than the gruelling long hours and isolation of house-maiding, the working classes schooled into middleclass values, aspired to homes of their own. Those aspirations were, of course, not always met. The rapid population increase which went hand in hand with the industrialisation of Launceston, and the subsequent financial depression of the early 1890s meant that many lived in overcrowded and insanitary conditions. It also saw the building of cheap speculative housing.

At the other end of the scale, houses were still being erected with a servant's room; the servicing of the house was kept as separate as possible from other functions. The arrangements of J & T Gunn's house at 58 York St, for instance, show the kitchen, store and servant's room taking up the back quarter with a separate downstairs entrance.



Others were coming to terms with the nonavailability of servants and reorientating the house accordingly. The architect, John Sulman, was perhaps a little ahead of his time when he spoke to an ANZAAS conference in Hobart in 1902:

...the solution can be materially aided by the architectural profession, if public interest can be aroused and the intense conservatism of the average middle-class man, and especially woman, can be broken down. For the dwellings we now possess, even the most modern, are based on the root idea of two classes inhabiting the same domicile...The complete severence of interest between mistress and maid did not fully develop till the last century, and may be traced to many causes. Hence, the houses of the nineteenth century show a distinct separation of the two sets of inhabitants, and writers on house-planning do not fail to emphasise the fact. This separation is particularly noticeable in the kitchen department, the servants' sitting and sleeping quarters, and staircases thereto, and the provision of a passage (misnamed a hall) to give access to the front door without passing through any of the rooms...

...The most radical changes will have to be made in the kitchen department, which, as now planned, assumes one servant to cook and and another to serve a meal in the dining room. When the members of the family, or an assistant of equal status, have to do the cooking and serving, the present arrangements are impossible...the kitchen must certainly be easily accessible from the dining room, or where a servant is not available, may open directly from it; and it might even be advisable that the opening should be wide, and closed with glazed doors, so that the stove may be in full view, while odour is kept out... ...the walls should be tiled throughout, the floor paved with marble, tiles, or some non-absorbant and impervious material...The dirty coal fire cooking-range must give place to a clean and perfected gas-cooker or electrical appliances as soon as they are available. These should be placed at such a height that no stooping is required...

One of the most difficult of domestic problems is that of "washing up" after meals. It is unpleasant work, and takes up a lot of time, Mr H. G. Wells, in his interesting forecasts of the present century, in the Fortnightly Review suggests soaking all the dirty articles in some chemical solution which would dissolve the grease, and then rinsing them in clean water. ... The crockery, &c., would be loosely packed in the sink, the cleansing solution run in and run off when it had served its purpose, the process repeated with clean rinsing water, and then by lighting gas heating jets underneath, the whole would be rapidly dried, and ready to put away for the next meal. ('The Twentieth Century House' Report of the Ninth Meeting of the Australasian. Association for the Advancement of Science Hobart, 1902 pp669-678.)

Introduction

This survey of vernacular architecture was inspired by the number of late Victorian and Federation suburbs which mushroomed after the mineral boom of the 1880s and to a large extent remain intact today. The houses, particularly of the later period, maintain a strong regional flavour, although this is usually superficial. Where mass-produced wrought iron work imbued Victorian houses with a certain sameness, timber fretwork enabled the builder to put more of his own individuality into at least the detailing of his work. There is, for instance, a marked difference between houses of this period in Westbury and those in Launceston. There are also many more timber buildings in this period than might be expected, although there are two explanations for this. There was a growing awareness of the usefulness of Tasmanian timber. The Building and Engineering Journal ran a series of articles in the early 1890s on Australian timber and the housing industry, and the advertisements of timber suppliers such as Charles Adams & Sons show an impressive range. Less impressive is perhaps the other reason for favouring timber. In the early 1880s when the building boom first took off, the Examiner noted that the standard of bricks was falling, demand was exceeding supply and with prices between £2/5/0 and £2/10/0 for 1000 bricks onto which often had to be added cartage from Westbury, Longford or Deloraine, builders were refusing contracts in brickwork because they felt they would only lose money on them.[27/4/1882]. Why, asked the Examiner, was no-one enterprising enough to lay out the £2000 necessary to install a steam brick works? There was already in existence Cornwell's Launceston Steam Brick, Pipe, Tile & Pottery Works (est 1879) but perhaps this was not on the scale required. Most bricks used on buildings of the 1890s in Launceston bear the markings of Cornwell's successors either Jory & Campbell or just Campbell. In 1898 J & T Gunn took over this Glen Dhu brickyard installing new machinery and producing 100 000 bricks daily. These would have been produced primarily for self-consumption, for not only were the Gunns by far the largest building firm in Launceston but they also constructed proportionately more brick buildings. In 1900, they built the first Sercombe's Patent 16 Chamber Patent Barrel Kiln in Australia which both increased their output and saved on fuel.[Building, Engineering & Mining Journal 28/4/1900].

Architects of this period were developing a new sense of space. Houses, instead of being façades with rooms attached to the back, were designed three-dimensionally. Spaces within rooms were experimented with, as was communication between them. Outside, brick and tiles were favoured, and sometimes ornamental shingles. Roof lines were important, and many houses were given ornamental ridgecapping, exaggerated

chimneys and asymmetrical projections to make these more pronounced. Many of the buildings in Elphin Road come into this category. Builders picked up the superficial detailing of the new style but, on the whole, failed to understand the new concepts of space (as, it must be admitted, did many architects). Instead, they continued to work to a Victorian plan, but began to introduce gables, timberworked ballustrades, valances, brackets and bargeboards, and a variety of new combinations of window. Perhaps the first of these houses was that in Trevallyn noted by "Observer" 1884:

... Mr Alex Young is erecting a very neat and picturesque cottage of a novel style of architecture known as Queen Anne. ...

It was thought that by extracting some of the details of each building and relating these to a builder, it would be possible to identify certain patterns with particular builders. In other words, if one had a house whose builder was unknown, the details could be noted and compared with the indexed details, which would then lead to a probable builder. It appears that this would work in only a few cases. On the whole the desire for individuality (in itself an interesting phenomenon) has meant that builders have varied their patterns from house to house and that often the similarity of houses is by locality rather than builder; as if neighbours have pointed to a house newly built and requested 'one of them', regardless of whom they have asked to build it. The index has become, then, more of a celebration of the immense variety of detailing, than a formal system of classification.

The enormous number of buildings involved in this survey has precluded the possibility of looking at every detail of every house, although it would be an interesting project on a lesser scale, such as the work of a single builder, or a street, or a small suburb. Instead, I have looked at three details on about 75% of the houses. These are the bargeboards, main windows and, in a last ditch but unsuccessful attempt to find uniformity, chimneys. Time did not permit the inclusion of two other important features, the brackets and valances, although, because their diversity is unquestionable, this would have no more provided an index than did the other details.

The main section of this survey is concerned with the builders operating in this period and the location of the houses they erected. Consistent records only exist from 1893, and it is from these that the bulk of the information has been gathered. Where a builder has been identified for a house of an earlier date this has been mentioned in the text rather than the listings.

A New Age was approaching. Launceston had excelled itself by being in 1895 (after eight years of deliberation) the first city in Australia to install hydro electricity. While for some years the benefits were seen to be primarily improved lighting and industrial motive power, domestic devices began to filter through. By 1903 the City Electrical Engineer was anticipating the need to extend the capacity of the transformers and the size of the mains to meet the growing popularity of electrical cooking appliances, radiators, boilers and flat irons. (Mayor's Valedictory Address. Launceston, 1903).

While the installation of electricity was being made more affordable through the introduction of a rental system, it was still expensive, and appliances were a luxury. The evolution of the labour-saving house was painfully slow. In contrast the fashions of external details were adopted with consummate ease.

All the listings, therefore, are from buildings for which approval was sought from the Launceston City Council. Locating the buildings was frequently a problem. Street numbers were not neccessarily given and, if the owners were also the occupants, they had to be traced through the Post Office Directories. Here street numbers were often not given either for the new suburbs, but at least the house could be seen in relation to intersecting streets and other houses. Where there was some consistancy of occupancy names of owner/occupiers could be traced through the directories until such time as street-numbering started to appear. Difficulties arose where the owner was not the occupier, as was frequently the case with lower value housing. In these cases the Assessment rolls were used to locate the name of the occupant, but often, either the owner possessed several buildings in the same street and it was not possible to ascertain which was the one in question (the Beaumont family, for instance, owned sixteen houses in Balfour Street), or the tenant changed so frequently that it was not possible to accurately trace Tracing buildings through the Assessment rolls is a them through. painstaking undertaking, especially through the 1890s when only supplementary rolls were published, and with the volume of houses involved it was not practicable. It should, however, be possible for people researching individual houses to do this. Occasionally the number seems clear but the house does not look right - it may be that it is a Californian Bungalow, a style that did not come to Launceston until after the Great War - in these cases I have included the number but indicated that the house has not been located. It is probable that it is close, adjacent or a couple of doors away, and the number may provide a guide. Often, in the newer streets, numbering was adjusted to meet the needs of the most recent buildings. Wellington Street, during the period under discussion, ended at Frankland Street and then became Wellington Road. The other pitfall in the location of houses is the change of street names. I have included a list of these

Builders have been identified by their signatures on building applications to Launceston City Council. These names have then been checked against those listed under 'Builders and Contractors' in the Trades section of Wise's Post Office Directories for the relevent years. There are many discrepencies. Occasionally builders appear in the directory who do not appear to have done any work but far more often names on the building applications do not appear in the directories. There are several possible explanations for this. 1. The application may have been mistakenly signed by the owner or speculator. 2. The building may have been erected by the owner who was not normally a builder, such as W Rosevear who built a villa in Invermay 'by himself in his spare time' [Weekly Courier 28/11/1912].

It is fairly easy to ascertain whether the names of owner and builder correspond, and often possible to discover whether this person is listed in the directory as having an entirely different profession. Caparatus was a Fishmonger, for instance. What is not clear is whether the signature in such a case was the result of a mistake. 3. It might have been signed by an employee of a building firm. 4. A builder normally employed by a building firm may have built one or two houses on the side. It seems likely that such arrangements may have occurred with some regularity. Even formal associations between builders were subject to frequent changes. may account for the number of building details which are repeated by ostensibly different builders [In larger firms this might be explained by the exchange of labour during work fluctuations. Certainly such arrangements occurred in other industries (viz Campbell's & McHugh's). It is with the lower than average valued house, usually in working class suburbs that the discrepencies most often appear; and it seems more than likely that a casual network of mutual assistance existed in these areas.

In 1907 the municipal boundaries of Launceston were extended to include Invermay and Trevallyn [City of Launceston. Mayor's valedictory address and annual departmental reports,1907. Tasmania: Launceston City Council, 1908.] Several street names were found to be duplicated. For this and other reasons the following streets have been renamed at some stage between the period under review and now:

The Crescent That section of Bain Terrace between Forest Rd

and Gorge Road as well as Gorge Rd from that intersection to its meeting with Trevallyn Rd. To avoid confusion with The Crescent, Newstead, now

Churchill Crescent.

Cumberland St Situated between Frankland and Cleveland Streets,

it was removed to make room for the new General

Hospital.

Douglas St, Invermay Now Clyde St. To avoid confusion with Douglas St

Newstead.

Elphin St Now Lime Ave

Fitzwilliam St Now Hollingsworth St

Frank St That part of Herbert Street between Bryan and

Forster Streets. To avoid confusion with Frank St.

Inveresk.

Gunn St Now Holbrook St. To avoid confusion with Gunn St

Newstead

King St That part of Taylor St between Albion St and

Invermay Rd. To avoid confusion with King St off

Charles St.

Mault St Now Mann St. I cannot find a reason for this

change. It seems regrettable that we have removed this tribute to a man who did much to

improve the public health of this city.

The Suburbs

The mineral discoveries of the 1870s, and their subsequent exploitation by predominantly local companies, had, within a decade, noticably affected the building industry in Launceston. One lyrical reporter noted the changes:

Macbeth's celebrated exclamation whilst awaiting the approach of the English soldiers upon Dunsinane "The cry is still they come" might well be applied to Launceston - not in regard to warriers, but merely to demonstrate the great rapidity with which buildings are springing up at all sides. Almost in every street of importance or otherwise the eye of the observant passer-by is attracted either by noticing workmen busily engaged in the erection of certain public or private domiciles, or a significant pile or two of bricks stacked on a vacant patch of ground informs him that another building is shortly to be added to the many that at present comprise a rapidly advancing town, which promises in a few years time to assume the proportions of a fine and handsome city. [Examiner 10/6/1882]

Three months later he was still gasping at the speed of change:

There appears to be no sign of pause or check in the present busy state of the building trade; on the contrary the town seems to be steadily progressing, both in the extension of its suburbs, and in the improvement of the town proper, the latter by the erection of substantial and handsome buildings on vacant allotments... altogether fresh areas contiguous to town have been thrown open to the public for selection, as, for instance, Lawrence Paddock, blocks at Invermay and Mowbray and part of the Trevallyn Estate. No-one, however, will deny that there is still ample room for improvement, the number of wretched tenements in various quarters of the town, all in a more or less decayed, filthy and dangerous state, being very considerable. we hail with satisfaction the demolition of these rookeries as they vanish from sight in ones and twos...[Examiner 9/9/1882]

Launceston faced the same problems as other places of rapid growth. The

demands for sewerage, water, roads and gas were hard to meet. Fortunately, considerable concern was shown by both citizens and aldermen that Launceston should be a well planned city and preferably a sanitary one as well. The not easily pleased W.G. Spence, president of the Australian Workers Union, was impressed by Launceston's municipal socialism in 1909:

Many of the municipalities (in Australia) now own baths, sale-yards, abattoirs, etc. Launceston, Tasmania is the most advanced. It owns practically all public utilities. It has a splendid electric power and light supply produced by water power obtained by putting a tunnel through a hill and tapping a river. From the profits of their water supply they built a large hall. They have large workshops, and possess hot, cold, and swimming baths, a fine museum and art gallery, a zoo and public gardens. They have a pension system for their employees, and altogether they are up-to-date. [W.G. Spence Australia's Awakening. Sydney: The worker trustees, 1909. pp468-9.]

He was less flattering about her southern neighbour and the 'boosters-up of private enterprise dominating the City Council of Hobart.'

Hobart did not, of course, have a monopoly over conflicting interests. Launceston's first Health Officer not only expererienced considerable reluctance on the part of some aldermen to comply with the rules of sanitation they had to some extent themselves drawn up, but faced a campaign lasting many years to have him removed because he was too diligent and appeared unable to distinguish alderman property owners from slum landlords. In spite of the many efforts to deter the Health Officer from carrying out his duties, 1404 houses were 'dealt with' between 1883 and 1890. [Examiner 3/2/1891 quoted in Petrow p149] There is no doubt that the efforts of 'that Indian cow doctor', as the Health Officer was known to his detractors, and those of Mault, the Government Health Officer, who was meticulous in his plans for Launceston's sewage system, made the town a healthier place.

By 1907 suburbs outside Launceston had grown to such an extent that the municipal boundaries were expanded to include Trevallyn and Invermay. Their inclusion was further strengthened by the laying on of tramways, which, in turn, made them more attractive to home-builders. The southern boundary at Melbourne St was not extended in spite of rapid growth in

Lawrence Vale. In the last twenty years of the nineteenth century Launceston changed from a predominantly valley settlement to one which appreciated 'pure air and lovely aspect'. The hills surrounding the urban centre provided desirable sites, and the suburbs of East Launceston, Elphin, West Launceston, Trevallyn, Windmill Hill, the hillier parts of Invermay, and Hampden/ Galvin Town were covered with dwellings, as were the less elevated areas of the Brickfields, Glen Dhu and Inveresk (less kindly known as 'The Swamp'). The latter were not only less elevated geographically but also, generally, socially. The status scale (based on occupation, property value and ownership) was something like this:

Elphin, Windmill Hill
East Launceston, West Launceston & Trevallyn
Glen Dhu, Invermay, Galvin Town/Hampden
Inveresk, Brickfields.
These will be discussed in alphabetical order.

Brickfields

The Margaret St Brickfields area was one of the first to be settled, its situation on the creek being initially advantageous. As the population grew the creek became an open sewer, the brickfield a sodden pit into which refuse, including animal carcases, was dumped. Several noisome trades were carried out here including Turner's large tannery, and the gool marked the northen end of the area. With the advent of municipal government and the concommittant civic pride, however, improvements were made. The sewer was bricked in, Portsmouth Square was created out of the brickfield, and eventually noisome trades were banished, or at least new ones were not issued permits. The area no longer defined the western limit of the town and those who now commuted to West Launceston and Glen Dhu, and did not wish to have their senses assaulted en route supported the cleaning up of the area. The lower reaches of West Launceston also began to creep into Margaret Street, and the southern end became quite respectable. The Roman Catholic Church of the Apostles and the Presentation Convent provided a focal point and many Irish names are listed as occupants of the area. Wesleyans, too, were catered for.

East Launceston

The main artery of East Launceston, Abbott St boasted more new houses than any other street in the period 1894-1914. Thirty-nine applications were received by the Launceston Council, indicating that about two thirds of the total number of buildings (sixty-two) were built in those years. In 1907 J&T Gunn won a contract to build a substantial state school to cope

with the new influx. The occupants of the new houses were mixed. Several builders made their own homes there. At the northern end, bordering on to Claremont Street in Elphin, St John David, the council engineer had a house built for himself and another next door to let. Others built to let on a larger scale; Mrs Robertson had four constructed in 1905. A number of widows chose this quiet suburb. At the top of the hill in Chant Street the Alexander North designed St Aidan's Anglican Church was built by J & T Gunn in 1894 and served both East Launceston and Elphin. The building didn't stop at the St Leonard's boundary, James Wright of Hinman & Wright and Charles Dodgshun, the boot factory owner, both selected sites on the southern side of David Street.

Elphin

While Brickfields could be said to have grown organically around the Creek, the infrastructures of the community growing with the population, Elphin was a suburb of the new kind. It was a retreat from the town, a withdrawal from the community. In the Brickfields, like Galvin Town, Inveresk and other suburbs houses faced the streets. Their verandahs and tiny front gardens invited neighbourly intercourse. In Elphin the hedges were grown high. When houses in this suburb were described they were described individually. Edwardian Elphin was lined with European trees. These were extended up the smaller streets Lime Avenue, Pen-y-Bryn, etc. The houses here were generally architect designed and substantial. They included such facilities as libraries, studies and dressing rooms and, of course, rooms for the servants. Launceston Ladies College in Elphin Road provided a suitably serene environment, for the daughters of the residents.

Galvin Town/ Hampden

Galvin Town's spectacular growth in the 1880s is best described by a contemporary observer:

Eighteen months ago Mr Charles Galvin bought the ten acre block running from Wellington Road to Mulgrave Street and with it the commodious building now the property of Mr A C Reed known as Apsley House. This ground has been cut into forty building blocks and disposed of to various persons. In the centre of the land runs Galvin Street, which is in the course of formation. In connection with this thoroughfare the residents would like to see the Corporation attend to its requirements before winter sets in, for the ground being of a soft nature would be rendered very slushy and uncomfortable by the rain. Bordering along

Galvin Street there are about twenty cottages erected, while about sixteen more have been commenced, and others will be started almost immediately. These buildings are for the greater part constructed out of weatherboard, several of them being of a superior class while all appear neatly designed and comfortable. A long felt want in this locality was an absence of water pipes, the residents in many instances having to bring supplies from some distance as best they could. This defect is now being remedied, for the Corporation are laying down pipes and there will soon be every facility for obtaining an abundance of water for general use and building purposes.

Adjoing the above mentioned ten-acre block is situated another of the same dimensions, owned by Messrs Adye Douglas and C Galvin which was formerly the property of the late Mr G This land was purchased by the above whitcombe of Hobart. gentlemen one year since and has been cut up into a number of building blocks, many of which have been sold, and building operations have been commenced on many of them. which extends from Wellington Road to Mulgrave Street, has Sarsfield (Garfield) Street, a thoroughfare 60ft in width, which is in course of formation, running through its centre, besides which it is intersected by North and South Streets. now only one ten-acre paddock remaining between the last two mentioned thoroughfares and Eardley Street. A portion of the block fronting onto Mulgrave Street has been purchased by Mrs James of the Sandhill, while the other blocks are being picked up The Wellington Road frontage had been bought by Mr Pilbeam who contemplates building upon it. The house formerly known as "Green Gate" has been purchased by Mr M'Donald. In the paddock-adjoining belonging to Mr Bryan improvements are going on and the formation of a five-roomed cottage is being laid. [Examiner 17/3/1882].

This suburb, the same reporter suggested some six months later,

might fitly be termed Galvin Town, after the enterprising individual who laid it open to the public for selection for building purposes. The growth of this locality in from 18 months to two years time from open cultivated paddock into a populous township is most most surprising and, judging by appearances, is not likely soon to come to an end. The streets, however sadly want

attention, being yet in a state of nature, and in wet weather the traffic, which is now considerable, is cutting up very badly.' [Examiner 16/9/1882]

Beyond the town boundary Messrs W Ritchie et al had purchased the land known as Lawrence Paddock into which they were cutting new roads. They advertised for sale building allotments fronting on Melbourne and Leslie Streets and Mulgrave Crescent. [Examiner 11/3/1882. Ad ran from 29/11/1881.] Further up Wellington Road, too, buildings were being erected.

61en Dhu

Glen Dhu emerged almost entirely as a suburb in the first decade of this century. Perhaps more than in any other suburb it could be identified with certain builders. So much so that streets were named after them - Knight and Wilson Streets for example. The great majority of the houses erected were of weatherboard in spite of the fact that this was a brick manufacturing area, After the Great War the suburb had a further growth spurt when Paton and Baldwin established their mill there. The integrity of this suburb has been entirely destroyed by the new Launceston Southern outlet.

Inveresk

An observer, writing of Inveresk in 1884, felt that not very long ago it had been a wet and dismal swamp, but that now it was a neat little suburb with cottages and villa residences and a park of its own' [Examiner 9/9/1884]. Others were less enthusiastic:

'On the swamp we notice fresh ground is still being covered by the builder though this is, to some extent, a matter of regret seeing that the formation and maintenance of good streets and the proper drainage of the locality must prove difficult and expensive undertakings to the Corporation. The reason why this should be is found in the low flat surface of this part of the town which precludes natural drainage, and also the soft spongy nature of the alluvial soil, both facts operating against the health of the residents. [Examiner 16/9/1882].

The Swamp (Inveresk) was being 'subdivided again and again' leading to the 'erection of cheap cottages by [and for] the labouring man, the result being

that a locality quite unfit for human dwellings is being rapidly covered with them [quoted by Petrow p 22]. In 1886 the Government Officer for Public Health, Alfred Mault spoke of severe overcrowding in this area with 47 people to the acre compared to 11.4 in central Launceston. The connection between overcrowding on undrainable land and disease became apparent when the the majority of enderic fever cases treated at the Launceston General Hospital were found to have originated from the Inveresk and Glebe swamps.[TPP 1886/139]. In 1891 the Launceston City and Suburbs Improvement Association, which primarily concerned itself with the beautification of the Gorge, was galvanised into action by the deplorable state of housing and drainage at Inveresk, organising a Chinese Carnival to raise funds. [Ex 31/1/1891, Reynolds 132]

Ironically, the problem was excacerbated by the Council's commitment to the installation of water closets. Launceston's situation, at the confluence of the North and South Esk rivers and the Tamar, meant that its shores were subject to considerable tidal variation. The sewage that was poured into these waters had a tendency to end up on the swamplands. Certainly, concurrently with the increase of waterclosets was an increase in the number of cases of diptheria and typhoid and both Drs Pike and Pardy accepted this as the reason. In spite of increased public concern in 1907 Inveresk was still the canker of Launceston's health record. Thirty-five cases of enteric fever, 47% of the total for Launceston originated there,

Invermay

The elevated sites of Invermay were sought after and stood in stark contrast to the undesirability of the Swamp. As the areas between the two filled up the distinctions became blurred. Most of Invermay was outside the Launceston boundary until 1907, but its growth began about twenty-five years earlier:

The Invermay Road . . . part of the town is decidedly growing of late in favour of private residences beyond the town boundary, Messrs S C Sadler and H Conway having secured 38 acres on the eastern side of the road just beyond the residence of John Whitefoord, which they intend to cut up and offer in lots suitable for villa residences. [Examiner 1/2/1882].

Sadler and Conway Streets on the Mowbray Hill indicate the site of this subdivision. A couple of months later the beautification of the area was being discussed, provoking the comment that 'when Invermay Park is laid out this portion of the town will prove one of its most attractive

suburbs. (Examiner 17/3/1882; tenders callled for design and estimate for laying out Invermay Park Examiner 11/3/1882). Certainly, the eastern side of Invermay Road was more sought after than the west which merged uneasily with Inveresk. Indeed,

'A lovelier and more English like vale in which to build a home could scarcely be found out of Great Britain, the tall hawthorn and sweet-briar hedges, with well laid-out gardens, orchards and plantations round the grounds, indicating refined taste and culture. The shrubberies attract the most musical and favourite birds of the colony, and amongst them the well known notes of the magpie are heard early morn and eve' [Examiner9/9/1882].

Trevallyn

Trevallyn emerged as a suburb when William Barnes Estate by the same name was subdivided. The area was well-defined and from its beginning had a closely knit group of residents. In March 1885, for instance, the landholders of 'this pretty little suburb' held a meeting at the Club Hotel to discuss utilities in the area. Together they sorted out the responsibility of the roads (Trevallyn was part of the West Tamar Road Trust until it was incorporated into Launceston in 1907), the size of gas pipes, police protection and what native trees to fell on the reserve to make way for the English ornamental ones. Among those present were Messrs Higgs(builder/architect/surveyor), Thrower (brewer), Green (ironmonger), Mr Waldorn being in the chair.[Examiner 3/3/1885]

For a suburb the site is an admirable one, and its name is quite in keeping with it. Not too far removed from the business part of town, and situated as it is on the side of a hill, the view from which is very charming. Trevallyn is doubtless becoming ere long a very popular suburb. The view of the town of Launceston, with the wharves and the river, the broad stretch of plain from the Tamar right away to Ravenswood with the mountains in the distance raising their peaks into the summer blue above, is a truly beautiful one and hardly to be surpassed in the island. The locality is healthy and the drainage should be all that can be desired. Roads have been cut and partly formed on an easily ascending grade, and water has been laid on, and gas will follow in a few months or so.

The suburb is divided into three sections or terraces, rising above one another from the West Tamar Road to the brow of the

hill. The first new street runs from the turn of the road just before reaching the Tamar Rowing Club sheds, and after about 400yards of ascending grade runs along the side of the hill parallel with the West Tamar Road. This will be called Trevallyn Street; from this street, just at the commencement of the level stretch, another road or street commences. This turns southward again and after skirting the back of the allotments facing the lower portion of Trevallyn Street sweeps round in a nice curve and runs along the hill, almost at the top parallel with the streets below. From the same starting point referred to another road runs with an easy gradient up the hill, taking a course north and eventually running parallel with the streets above and below. The land has been pegged off into 55 building allotments, and already 43 have been purchased and 12 houses have been built or are in course of erection. . .

Taken altogether the new suburb is a very nice one, and in a year or two will be quite studded with villa and cottage residences to which merchants and tradesmen can retire after the business troubles of the day are over, to smoke the pipe of peace in quietness and undisturbed by the noise and clatter of the town; and enjoy all the dolce far niente of a country village and rural retreat.[Examiner 9/9/1884]

In spite of the economic crisis of the early 1890s, building at Trevallyn continued.

During the last two or three years building has progressed steadily but lately it has taken quite a spurt and nearly twelve houses are in course of erection . . . In Trevallyn Road Mr Dalley has started a fine brick villa while two more handsome cottages will occupy the frontage of the lower road. J Cowling is just completing a spacious residence for Mr J Bain on the same road and Mr Gurr has begun another on one of the blocks lately submitted for sale by W Hartnoll. On the south road two neat cottages for Mr Gow are approaching completion while a little further up the hill Mr Jones has another of the same sort in hand for himself. On the far side of the creek the foundations of two or three more are visible. A fresh survey of allotments has been made further up the hill and a number found purchasers, access being provided by the formation of a new road that joins the "Terrace" near Mr Lewis' residence. At the head of the creek Messrs Higgs *pere et fils* have cleared and fenced in several

acres with a view of establishing an orchard. The local Town Board, with the parliamentary vote of £150 passed lately, have men employed taking off a portion of the curve on the road rising from the bridge – this is most necessary – narrowness of road, curve and incline make it dangerous for two vehicles meeting. Council have just substituted a 7 inch water main for 4 inch pipes and the latter are being used as extensions further up the hill. Growth of the suburb has induced the Launceston Omnibus Company to start a line of 'buses from Lyttleton Street to the top road – much appreciated by residents of the "Cornish" suburb. £5 per foot frontage lately paid for an allotment shows that pure air and lovely aspect are worth money. [Examiner 14/3/1892]


West Launceston

While views were sought after, the steep climb to many of the higher sites in West Launceston met with less enthusiasm, and much of this suburb grew up after reliable public transport had been made available. This was one area where noxious industries which had been established outside urban limit were now in the middle of residential areas. One such problem was the abattoir in Upton Street, another Ditcham's bone mill in Maitland St. With an eye for the quick buck, speculators had bought up land in these areas, subdivided and built on them, 'and now', argued the defense for the bonemill owner, they 'were moving Heaven and earth to get it moved so as to get a high price for their speculation, and out of no feeling of philanthropy towards the people in the neighbourhood'. [Ex 31/12/1890, 14/1/1891 Petrow San 167]. However justified his statement might have been the area became residential, Maitland Street, Upton Street, Stone Street and Hillside Crescent all mushroomed in this period.

Windmill Hill

Windmill Hill had long been seen as a desirable place to live and it is not surprising that the area grew fast during the boom years. High Street only lightly dotted with houses south of Ann Street was all but filled to Howick Street by 1914. Stewart Street, Welman, Adelaide and the eastern end of York all developed in this period. 'The vicinity of St Georges Square', was

'another rapidly growing suburb, and it is worthy of note that a fair proportion of the private residences erected of late, or in course of erection display a neatness of design which not only evidences an advance in public taste but renders the buildings worthy to keep pace with the progress and increased prosperity of the town. $\{Ex\ 17/3/1882\}$







At the turn of the century Charles Adams and Sons was considered one of the foremos't manufacturing firms. Established in 1884 as Messrs Adams Griffiths & Dudley, it was taken over entirely by the Adams family (father Charles, sons Harry and Frank) in 1893. In the same decade they remodelled the premises and plant and developed an intercolonial reputation for bent timbers. This was primarily redwood and bluegum made into rims, shafts, poles and side rails for the carriage building industry. Blackwood was sawn and exported in planks, flitches and square timber for turning. This side of their business was perhaps more important than the building contracting which does not appear to have entered the domestic field until 1900, although they were successful in winning some of the more substantial contracts in Launceston including the Margaret Street Methodist Church, the Charles Street warehouse and the clothing factory of P.O. Fysh & Co., the Frederick Street boot factory of Messrs B. G. Clark & Co., the St John Street grain store of Messrs D. Ritchie & Son. At Evandale they won the government tender for the Post Office.



Although obviously aware of the available Tasmanian woods Charles Adams & Sons imported deals, flooring and lining from the Baltic and Kauri pine from New Zealand. These along with paints, oils, glass, nails and architectural ironmongery from England, Europe and America, they would have made available to other building tradesmen [Cyc Tas pp109-110]. In 1906 their premises were totally destroyed by fire believed to have been caused by an electrical fault [Examiner 15/12/1906, Daily Telegraph 14/12/1906]. During reconstruction Messrs J & T Gunn and H T Russell offered them the use of their plants. Three years later Charles Adams died. His death went unnoticed unlike that of his rival Thomas Gunn whose own death occurred within a day. [Examiner 15&16/8/1910]



J & T Gunn Steam Joinery Works with extensions (Weekly Courier 7/3/1903)

'a few years back the machine moulding and turnery establishment next to the Club Hotel was erected to keep pace with the trade.' (John Gunn's obituary *Daily Telegraph* 17/3/1897)

At 50 Brisbane St, J&T Gunn's business premises, the ground floor with its kauri pine ceiling housed a suite of offices fitted with highly polished Tasmanian blackwood. The first floor contained ironmongery,builders' supplies and electric light fittings. The latter at the turn of the century was very up-to-date. On the second floor were displayed marble, slate and wooden mantles, register grates, tiled hearths, fenders, wallpapers and imported highly enamelled baths. On the next floor up what they called general stock was to be found. Another building could be reached from the second floor and here were kept kitchen ranges and encaustic tiles for walls and floors. The paint and oil department was in the brick and concrete basement and to the rear were further rooms of bulk ironmongery, doors etc and timber of local production and milling. (Cyc Tas)







J & T Gunn's Business Premises (Weekly Courier 7/3/1903)

Original partnership established in 1875 between John and Thomas Gunn [ads Walch appear 1879–1893. Listed in Manings under builders, also plasterers at 40 Brisb St; private res Thomas 60 Balfour St. PO Dir 1892/3 John 13 Elphin Rd (after 1897 Mrs J only) Thomas 72 York St incl 1902. PO ads 1900p131 & 1902. In 1902 Frederick Gunn of Elphin Rd is also listed as member of partnership.

'Mr W S Bell is having a very attractive villa residence erected at Invermay near the premises of Mr Room [eastern side of Invermay Rd near

Forster Street]. The house which is nearly finished is built of particoloured brick and is fitted with a finely designed iron verandah.' It boasted ten rooms, pantry, bathroom, store, workshop and washhouse. 'The building which is one-storeyed, stands back from the road and is erected on strong bluestone foundations 5 ft above ground. To the front door a flight of steps provides access and on the town side rises a tower 10ft square which shows well above the building. The drawing room is 16x15ft, dining room 16x20ft, principal bedroom 16x20ft and the others from 16x14ft downwards. Below the verandah will be fitted a quantity of tasteful lattice work. The main entrance will be from George Town Road [now Invermay Rd] and there will be a side entrance with steps leading to it under the tower. The front of the villa will be set off with cantlelevers [sic] and there will also be four bay windows fitted to it. The building, when completed wil be one of the finest in the vicinity where it stands. Messrs Gunn Brothers have the building contract. [Examiner 17/3/1882]

'Captain J C Taylor has erected at New Town near George Town Road [This was the area on the eastern side of Invermay Road between Forster Street and Mowbray. It is probable that Taylor Street was named after him and that his house is in the vicinity] a weatherboard cottage with corrugated iron roof containing five rooms and fitted with a verandah in front. The contractors are Messrs Gunn. At the rear of the above Mr S Richards has built has built a 4 room weatherboard cottage constructed by Messrs Gunn' [Ibid].

In Lyttleton St J & T Gunn were completing for W H Hunter to plans by H Conway a two storey brick residence picked out with white bricks and surrounded on three sides 'with an exceedingly handsome ornamental iron verandah and balcony'. The house consisted of eleven rooms apart from kitchen, scullery, storeroom etc. Of these the drawing room was 20x17ft, the dining room 22x17, the breakfast room 19x15ft, the spare room 16x15ft. Upstairs rooms measured 20x17ft, 14x17ft, 12x15ft and 10x15ft. At the rear of the house brick stables and a coach house with hayloft and groom's room overhead were erected. The cost of this building was £2200.

Just past the reservoir in Upper High Street (probably number 70) J & T Gunn were building George Lakin a neat weatherboard cottage to his own orders, while on the corner of High and Balfour Streets they had erected a 7 room weatherboard cottage with a verandah on two sides. A little further down from this in Balfour Street they built for Mr E Dickens three 6 roomed weatherboard cottages with verandahs and bay windows. [Examiner 24/3/1882]

A two-storey timber residence for Walter Ferrall was erected in Upper St John Street with verandah and balcony in front.[Examiner 9/9/1882]

At the western end of Frederick St a neat comfortable weatherboard 5 room cottage with verandah was built for Mrs C T Hadfield; and also for Mrs Hadfield a large wooden house with 8 rooms and a verandah around three sides at the junction of Frederick and Bourke Streets. Two 4 room weatherboard residences were constructed for Mr Moynahan in Cumberland Street [Examiner 16/9/1882]

A five-roomed residence was nearly finished for J Thurston in West Tamar Road. [Examiner 4/9/1889]

'Messrs J&T Gunn...have nearly completed Mr Kenworthy's villa at Trevallyn, which residence makes another addition to very many neat residences in this suburb'. [The Building & Engineering Journal 10/3/1894, p77.]


A Luttrell built two pairs of weatherboard and iron-roofed cottages in Holbrook St for C Manser and Messrs Anderson & Lahey. Each pair was divided by a party wall. All were built the same size and style with 'a natty little verandah in front'. These were under construction at the same time as a two storey brick store for T W Monds at the corner of William & George Streets.[Examiner 16/9/1882]

At Galvin Town he built a 'nice comfortable' 6 room residence in wood with a verandah in front for Mr W Lovett in Mulgrave St and two 5 room cottages for Mr Pilbeam in Eardley St. [Examiner 16/9/1882] He was also responsible for Ley's (later Park) Hotel in Invermay Rd, designed by H Conway, of which there is a long description in the Examiner 17/3/1882. To another design by H Conway he erected on the western side of Invermay Rd near Landale St (where the tollgate was) two single-storey weatherboard villas for Mr Charles Tregurtha. Each contained six rooms as well as a servant's bedroom, bathroom and pantry. The drawing room was 14x19ft, dining 14x14ft and bedrooms 15x14ft and 15x13ft. window and verandah front and back made the buildings attractive while still being substantial. [Examiner 17/3/1882]. He erected a very similar villa for Mrs West in Upper George St near Canning St, and in My St under the name Luttrell & Fletcher two single-storey 6 room weatherboard cottages with galvanised iron roofs for Mr L Fairthorne.[Examiner 24/3/18821

Building & Engineering Journal 4/11/1893: 'The erection of two new villa residences in Mulgrave-street, Hampden, Launceston, has made a decided improvement in the appearance of that locality. Until a few months ago there was a vacant plot of ground close to the junction of Galvin and Mulgrave-streets, which was utilised as a depository for heaps of rubbish. The allotment was purchased by Mr E Solomon and the site being an excellent one for building purposes, a contract for the erection of two brick residences was undertaken by Mr Arthur Reynolds, who has just completed his work. The foundations are of concrete and bluestone, and each cottage contains the following rooms which are all lofty, being 12ft. high:- drawing-room, 18ft.x12ft., bed-room, 14ft.x12ft., dining-room, 16ft.x12ft., bath-room, 12ft.x5ft., bedroom, 13ftx12ft, kitchen, washhouse, and other conveniences. The front verandahs are roomy, and have ornamental posts, with massive moulded caps and bases. The bricks used in the work are of uniform color, and the front portions of the buildings being tucked pointed, the effect is rather pleasing. At the rear of the buildings there are large yards and gardens. The front fences and gates are of Huon pine, and the design is quite new. The builder, Mr A Reynolds is to be congratulated upon the successful completion of his work and its appearance, for the architectural design was his own, and he has carried out the details of his contract in such a manner as to leave nothing to be desired, the result being sound work and a neat finish, the important matter of durability also having been attended to.'(p 187)

(a) 'Attention is directed to the handsome terraces which now grace the site occupied for years by Ackerman's Baths and "Old Curiosity Shop", at the corner of Charles and Cameron streets. Mr John Hart purchased the site after Mr Ackerman's death, and, determining to have private dwellings erected upon it, instructed Mr E Laidlaw, architect, to prepare the necessary plans, the work of constructing being placed in the hands of Messrs H T Russell & Sons,the well-known builders of York Street, Launceston. "Middlesex Terrace", which faces Cameron St, embraces eight residences, including two extra-commodious structures at each end, and six eight-roomed houses. "Cornwall Terrace" [D] fronts on Charles street and comprises three residences. The terraces are red-fronted with well carried out tuck-pointed work to enhance the general appearance. The balconies and verandahs tend to set off the buildings, while the iron post and panel work, also the tiled floors and paths, furnish evidence of artistic designing and skilled artisanship. The substantial wrought-iron

fencing is fixed on a concrete base. A feature in ornamentation is introduced in the panels over the arches, which are covered with peacock green glazed tiles, these giving a very pleasing effect. Terracotta panels are noticable in the ornamental cement work, giving the whole a handsome finish. The interiors are fitted with modern appliances, such as electric light, gas for stoves, ranges, hot and cold water to sink and baths, etc. The new terraces are without a doubt an ornament to the city, and reflect great credit to Messrs Russell & Sons, and the others who were concerned in their erection.' The signatures on the building applications are simply 'Titmus' and it is difficult to know which of this family of builders is responsible for what. In 1874 William Titmus owned a timber yard at the intersection of St John and Cameron Streets. Charles Titmus and George Titmus are both listed as builders between 1902 and 1914, the former at Cressy, the latter at Perth. It seems likely that one or both of these was responsible for the Abbott Street houses. Frank H Titmus is listed as a builder of 34 Mann Street Invermay in the 1924 Post Office Directory, and was probably responsible for the many Titmus dwellings in that street beween 1914 and 1921.


