#### INTRODUCTION

The Rotary Club of Launceston, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Melbourne, was the first in Tasmania. The inaugural meeting was held on 18 February 1924 at the Brisbane Hotel and the first luncheon took place at the hotel on 27 February. The Club was chartered with a membership of 25 and by the end of the year membership stood at 34. Dr John (later Sir John) Ramsay was the Charter President: in 1926/27 he served a second term as president, the only person to serve twice.

Rotary, founded by Paul Harris in Chicago in 1905, bases its operations around the credo of 'Service Above Self'. Its four avenues of service are directed towards club, community, vocational and international programs. The movement, with vocation the basis of membership, spread to Australia in 1921 when clubs were established in Melbourne and Sydney.

A booklet published by the Rotary Club of Launceston as part of its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations in 1999 recorded some of the Club's notable achievements. The following activities highlighted in the booklet are in chronological order:

Relief work undertaken by the Club in the aftermath of the disastrous 1929 flood Erection of a hut on Scout Island, Corra Lynn

Paul Harris's visit to Launceston in 1935 when he planted a tree of remembrance in Royal Park

Windmill Hill Community Centre project

Barbecue at Bonnie Beach and at Rotary Park, Hillwood

1960s project, St Paul's Church, Ainslie House

Preservation work carried out on 'Miss Flinders', historic Bass Strait aircraft

Rhododendron Gardens, Punch Bowl Centre

Clennett Memorial entrance at Gorge Reserve erected

Initiated restoration of water-powered Brindley organ in Albert Hall

Barbecues, shelters and outdoor furniture provided in the grounds of National

Trust property Clarendon

Wheel of *Defender*, Tasmania's entry in the Australian Bi-centenary Tall Ships race, carved and fitted

Playground equipment provided for Invermay Primary School

Ravenswood Community Centre painted and refurbished

Purchased antique furniture items for National Trust property Franklin House

Gazebo at Masonic Memorial Peace Haven constructed

Train engine for children's playground at Perth

Assisted with restoration of suspension bridge, haulage motor shed and power station museum at Duck Reach

A long-standing project, the 'Bring out a Briton' scheme, instituted in 1958-59, had assisted 144 people to settle in Tasmania by 1974. The Club ran a 'Garden Spectacular' at Youngtown in 1986, the precursor to the popular annual garden festivals. In 1987 a successful air pageant was organised at Launceston Airport.

Included in the Club's record of service are the working parties of members which undertook international service projects in Western Samoa in 1996 and 2000. The Club has been a strong supporter of the Rotary Youth Exchange program.

External extension commenced in 1928 when the Rotary Club of Devonport was sponsored, the first of a number of clubs to be sponsored. In 1982 the Club initiated the formation of the Probus Club of Launceston.

Over the years several members have been knighted for their service to the country: Sir John Ramsay, Sir Claude James, Sir Gordon Rolph, Sir Raymond Ferrall and Sir Geoffrey Foot. Many more have been recipients of Imperial and Australian honours. A W Monds, Frank Warland Browne, Frank F Boatwright, Clarry Pryor, Dick Green, David Gunn, Sinclair Thyne, Max Cleaver, Reg Walker and Graeme Beams have served as mayors of Launceston, whilst others have been elected as aldermen. Women were first admitted to the Club in 1995.

By 2000 the Club had named 40 Paul Harris Fellows, amongst the earliest being John Grove, Alan Abbott and Bev Lawrence.

The Club has been involved in a wide and impressive range of community programs and activities through its strong support for numerous local charities and organisations and also at an international level.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in August 2005.
