INTRODUCTION

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INTRODUCTION

The Tasmanian Dance Company was established in Launceston in 1981 as Australia's first dance-in-education company. The formation of the company followed discussions between the State Government and the Commonwealth funding authority regarding a new direction for dance in Tasmania. Among their considerations were the importance of fostering future audiences for dance and the need to encourage the development of arts-in-education programs.

The dance-in-education team was to offer dance education activities through the education system and to be capable of theatre-based performance as well as regional community and school performances. It was envisaged that the dance education program would bring the majority of Tasmanian students in contact with dance and gain greater acceptance for dance. The Tasmanian Dance Company was governed by a board of directors.

Jenny Kinder, an experienced dancer, choreographer, teacher and director, was appointed artistic director of the Tasmanian Dance Company in May 1981. The company's base was the government owned premises at 197 Wellington Street, at that time in a very run-down condition. In 1985 the National Trust classified premises were extensively renovated by the government and officially opened in December that year.

The company's prime focus was dance-in-education. Its unique school residency program was launched with a shared residency between West Launceston Primary School, Trevallyn Primary School and Launceston Community College in September 1981. Visiting both primary and secondary schools, the company became renowned for its dedication and innovation both in education and artistic areas and soon the demand for the residency program far exceeded its capacity. The program involved student participation in movement workshops, observing the dance company class and rehearsal and seeing a performance of modern dance created especially for school audiences. Performances were tailored to various audience groups – primary schools, secondary schools and colleges, and adults.

In May 1987 the Tasmanian Dance Company changed its name to Tasdance to reflect the contemporary nature of the company's artistic policy and the vitality of a company devoted to working with young people.

After the first decade Tasdance broadened its role to include more activity in the areas of theatre-based performance, dancer development and community work. Two important outcomes of this broader operating brief were the ability of the company to dedicate itself more fully to choreographic development and also to develop audiences for contemporary Australian dance.

In 1992 Tasdance, in association with the Launceston City Council, presented *Illuminations* at the Cataract Gorge, its first large-scale community performance.

Due to the uncertainty of funding which threatened the viability of the company, Jenny Kinder resigned in 1994.

Karen Pearlman and Richard Allen, joint artistic directors from 1995 to 1996, introduced a range of works that often incorporated new media and text. They also made a number of works for film.

Annie Greig was appointed artistic director in 1997 and the company's name was changed to Tasdance.

The company has performed at various arts festivals in its home state and throughout mainland Australia. In addition it has undertaken a number of national and international tours, including Christchurch, New Zealand in 1990, China and Taiwan in 1994, New York in 1995, Korea in 2002 and India in 2003.

Since 1998 Tasdance has undertaken annual educational performance projects. School students from around the state are auditioned to become part of a student company working for a short time as dancers, then touring with their completed work to Launceston, Hobart and a centre on the north west coast.

The company has usually employed six full time dancers and others on a seasonal basis, nearly all coming from mainland Australia. Work has been commissioned from many distinguished Australian choreographers and the company has earned a national reputation for its repertoire of contemporary Australian work.

Tasdance is Tasmania's premier contemporary dance company. It provides opportunities for young dancers and emerging choreographers as well as recognised practitioners and contributes significantly to the development and understanding of contemporary dance in Tasmania.

The collection was donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in 1995, 1996 and 2007. It is the company's intention to continue to donate its records to the Museum.
