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INTRODUCTION

The Launceston Players Society was founded in September 1926 to spread appreciation and understanding of the stage within the community. It is now reputed to be Australia's oldest continuously operating amateur theatrical society. From an original membership of 19, it had 172 members by 1938. Some original members had been associated with earlier groups (eg The Strollers). The Society's membership has always drawn on diverse sections of the Launceston community. Meetings are held monthly, and executive officers are elected annually. In any one year, a member may take part in several dramatic, musical and social activities, including acting, direction, stage management, or simply be a member of the audience. Some well known names associated with the Launceston Players include Colonel G E Harrap (first President), Mrs W K McIntyre (an early member), Max Oldaker (actor), Valerie Pennefather (singer), and John Lohrey (director).

The first play mounted by the Society was *Nothing But The Truth* (1926). By 1946 it had put on 32 public productions as well as some private ones. In the 1930's and 1940's the Launceston Players held regular play readings in the former Mechanics' Institute. During the 1939-1945 War they continued presenting two plays each year, contributing the proceeds to patriotic funds. In 1947 they performed at a Community Drama Festival in Sydney, and have had a close association with the Tasmanian Drama Festival since its inception that same year.

The Society has a reputation for a consistently high standard of presentation. Its repertoire ranges from drama to comedy, with usually three or four performances of each production. In 1960 the Launceston Players amalgamated with the Launceston Musical Festival Society (founded in 1942), their first joint production being *Bless the Bride*. The Players have since staged several musicals. They have also engaged in Old Time Music Hall activities, revue, period re-enactments, musical comedy, and for several years had a lively theatre restaurant association with the former Launceston Hotel.

By 1950 the Society's wardrobe included some 500 pieces, and continues to be a comprehensive costume collection (available for hire) representative of all periods of theatrical history. For many years this collection was housed in the Albert Hall.

The Society has never had its own theatre. Productions have been staged in the Academy Theatre, the former Little Theatre (Tamar Street), Princess Theatre, National Theatre, the 7NT radio station studio in the Quadrant and, most recently, in the Earl Arts Centre. Post war hopes to have a theatre built on Windmill Hill as part of the Launceston War Memorial Community Centre were unfulfilled. Attempts to develop a new Little Theatre complex in the late 1970's and early 1980's were also unsuccessful, despite state and local government lobbying.and a shortlived purchase of Chalmers Church for the purpose in October 1986

The Launceston Players Society records include minute books (covering executive and annual general meetings), correspondence, newsletters (*News-n-Views* has been published monthly since January 1950), programmes (autographed and mint copies), and other miscellaneous material. The collection was acquired by the Queen Victoria Museum in November 1994 and has been added to in June 2002 and June 2003.
